
The Quarterly Trend Reports: Billboard Hot 100 Top 10 Trends



- 90% contain 2 verse sections
- 80% have a Hip Hop influence
- 80% are in a minor key
- 70% are 3:30 or longer
- 70% are under 89 BPM
- 60% are both sung and rapped




The graph below compares Q1 2018 with Q1 2017 as well as 2017 as whole.































popular lyrical theme in the Top 10.




Hip Hop: Q1 The average tempo was 77 BPM, 67% were under 80 BPM.




Pop: Q1 The average tempo was 85 BPM, 67% were between 80-109 BPM.



Hip Hop: Year Over Year Avg. tempo has decreased from 100 BPM in 2014 to 75 BPM in 2017. Q1 remains in line with 2017 at 77 BPM. Pop: Year Over Year Avg. tempo decreased from 108 BPM in 2015 to 93 BPM in 2017. In Q1 it further dropped to 85 BPM.











