The State of the Hot 100 Top 10 takes an in-depth look at Q1 - Q3 2021's compositional and industry-related trends for the Billboard Hot 100 Top 10. What follows are a few select highlights from the report.

- Data is for songs that charted in the Billboard Hot 100 Top 10 and excludes holiday songs.
- Data related to compositional characteristics are propriety to Hit Songs Deconstructed.
- Artist, songwriter, producer, label and charting information are aggregated from the PRO's, Billboard, and streaming platforms.
- All credits are from the date songs entered the Top 10.
- At times percentages may not add to 100% due to numbers being rounded up or down.
- Production teams (i.e. The Audibles) are counted as a single producer.







Songwriter Team Size Q1-Q3 2021





Producers

In the first three quarters of 2021, songs with only one producer fell to their lowest level in well over five years, accounting for just under one-fifth of songs. Simultaneously, larger producer teams are getting more popular, with teams of three nearly doubling to just over one-third of songs.








Record Labels

Twelve record labels had songs charting in the Hot 100 Top 10 in the first three quarters of 2021. Republic has had by far the most Top 10 hits so far in 2021 with 20, double the number of hits from runner-up Interscope. This is largely due to Drake's record-breaking nine simultaneous Top 10s.




Labels with the Most Top 10 Hits

2021 TikTok Hits

While just about every Top 10 hit has been used and promoted on TikTok, there are some hits that overwhelmingly owe their initial rise to fame to the app.

In the first three quarters of 2021, the most notable were: *Drivers License*, which had a popular trend involving the song's emotional chorus and bridge; *Astronaut In The Ocean*, which had its chorus featured in both comedic and serious videos alike; and *Fancy Like*, *Mood* and *What You Know Bout Love*, all of which were featured in popular choreographed dances, among other uses.



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Primary Genres: Top 10

The two most prominent genres, which together represented 77% of the Top 10 during the first three quarters of 2021, were hip hop and pop.


After seeing its prominence cut nearly in half in 2019, hip hop as a primary genre rebounded in 2020 and remains the most popular genre YTD.

However, it's important to note that in Q3, Drake landed a slew of hip hop Top 10 hits from his album *Certified Lover Boy,* which made up eight of the quarter's 11 hip hop hits, most of which stayed in the Top 10 for only one week.

Pop accounted for 36% of the year's Top 10 hits with chart-toppers including *Good 4 U, Butter, Stay* and *Save Your Tears.*

Q1 - Q3 2021




R&B/soul is up from 8% to 15% as a primary genre and gaining even more momentum as a genre influence. The genre was represented by #1 hits *Leave The Door Open* and *Peaches*.

Country was represented by Fancy Like, I Hope and Wasted On You, and rock and Latin were represented by Jail and Yonaguni, respectively.




Songs that Charted for 10+ Weeks in the Top 10

While hip hop was the most popular genre in the overall Top 10, when looking specifically at songs that charted for 10+ weeks in the Top 10, pop was the most prominent genre, accounting for 61% of songs.

When looking at songs that remained in the Top 10 for just one week, the most prominent genre was hip hop.




Primary Genres: #1 Hits

Fourteen songs charted at #1 during the first three quarters of 2021.

While hip hop was the most popular genre in the overall Top 10, when looking specifically at number one hits, pop was the most prominent genre, accounting for 57%.


Song Length: Top 10

In the first three quarters of 2021, 37% of all Hot 100 Top 10 hits were under three minutes long.

Average song length was 3:24.



Non-Hip Hop: Q1 - Q3 2021



Outside of hip hop, average song length was shorter than the overall Top 10, landing at 3:16.


The under three minute range was the most popular, accounting for 40% of songs following a year-over-year increase since 2017, when only 7% of songs were under three minutes.

Among hip hop songs, average song length was longer than the overall Top 10, landing at 3:35.

The under three minute range was also the most popular. With the exception of the 3:00 - 3:29 song length range, which plunged from 52% in 2020 to just 13% YTD, all other song length ranges increased in prominence, most notably the 4:00+ range, which rose from 10% in 2020 to 25% YTD. This is largely due to Drake's influx of lengthy Top 10s.

Song Length Range


Hip Hop: Q1 - Q3 2021



Song Length: Staying Power & #1 Hits


Staying Power

While average song length for the overall Top 10 was 3:24, when looking specifically at songs that charted for 10+ weeks in the Top 10, average song length was much shorter at 3:07. On the flip side, when looking at songs that charted for just one week in the Top 10, the average song length was much longer, averaging 3:46.

When looking at #1s, average song length was even shorter, landing at 3:01.





On the Rise



Songs with an R&B influence have become more prominent in the Top 10, rising from 29% in 2020 to 47% YTD.

Songs that establish an instrumental hook that will later be used throughout the song increased from 35% in 2020 to 46% YTD.





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
