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The K.I.S.S. ME principle stands for keep it simple, singable and memorable and is at the core of most hit song melodies."

It encompasses 5 key elements.



Keep Your Melodies in an Easy-To-Sing Range

If the range is too wide, or too high or low for the average listener to sing comfortably, it's going to diminish their ability to sing along with the song.



Use Abundant Stepwise/Stagnant Motion and Small Intervallic Leaps

Too many pronounced leaps or vocal acrobatics will make it much more difficult for the average listener to sing along and fully engage.



Incorporate Logically Unfolding Melodic Patterns

If your melodies have a lot of disjointed shifts, it's going to make it much harder for the listener to follow along and remain engaged.





Use Simple, Easy-To-Lock into Rhythms

The more complex your rhythms, the more difficult it is for the listener to remain locked in.





Keep Lines and Phrases on the Shorter End

The longer the length of your lines, the more difficult it is for the listener to remember.

- Use short standalone lines and phrases
- Use the HSD "Phone Number" method: Break longer-length lines into shorter, easier-to-digest segments through rests, melodic and/or rhythmic contrast



Balance K.I.S.S. ME and non-K.I.S.S. ME qualities to create engaging, memorable melodies.

While most hit song melodies largely adhere to the K.I.S.S. ME principle, they also incorporate non-K.I.S.S. ME qualities to keep things interesting and prevent a generic, lackluster listening experience.



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Example of How to Balance K.I.S.S. ME and non-K.I.S.S. ME qualities to create engaging, memorable melodies.

One or two pronounced intervallic leaps to heighten interest.



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Logically unfolding stepwise melodies and simple eighth and quarter note-driven rhythms to ensure the listener still easily connects and remembers what they're hearing.
